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Curriculum and Learning Materials

The Certificate Program is a comprehensive and effectively sequenced system of music study and standard of assessment that provides a clear path for well-rounded musical training, from beginner to advanced levels. Available for 21 instruments, Speech Arts, and voice, it encompasses:

- Ten levels (1-10) plus Preparatory Levels and Professional ARCT designations.
- Repertoire, etudes, ear tests, intervals, chords, playbacks/singbacks, and sight reading at each level.
- The academic subjects of rudiments, harmony, analysis, and history.

The Value of Royal Conservatory Examinations

A Certificate of Achievement can be earned at each level of study by successfully completing a Royal Conservatory examination. Students preparing for examinations practice more consistently and advance more quickly. Preparing for and successfully completing an examination builds self-confidence and helps students develop a sense of pride.

Practical examinations evaluate the performance of repertoire, etudes or vocalises, ear training, sight reading, and orchestral excerpts for string, brass, and wind instruments. Written examinations evaluate the understanding of rudiments, harmony, counterpoint, analysis, and music history.
